Dilston Grove, SE16 2DD: Sat & Sun 12 – 6pm

Six artists will work in Dilston Grove in a sequence of week-long mini-residencies. Picking up where the previous artist left off, each will respond to what has been left behind. WAKE (visible tracks of turbulence) interrogates notions of ownership, of collective process, of where a work begins or ends, of materiality itself and the non-verbal transmission of ideas.

The remnants and materials will become a binding force between the six artists, as they inhabit each other's past and future. The audience can see and experience the results of each residency every weekend and trace the narrative of this particular space, time and group of artists.




Cafe Gallery, SE16 2UA: Wed to Sun 12 – 6pm

Installation and performance artists will occupy the same gallery for six weeks. Struggling for autonomy, each will mark his or her territory, camp or nest. The exhibition will change and grow over time as the artists vie and negotiate with one another.

Simultaneously standing alone and sharing a common space, they may choose to defend or attack, to trade or to steal, perhaps to start a war or to coexist peacefully. Audiences are invited to visit the space throughout the process, when at any one time a selection of artists may be present, building, modifying or dismantling their islands.


