Geraldine Pilgrim's acclaimed performance, *Handbag*, is re-imagined for two very different venues over two weekends this February. On Saturday 16 February it will appear at the Corn Exchange, Brighton in a co-production between Royal Pavilion & Museums and Brighton Dome. On Sunday 24 February it is coming to the People's Palace, London as part of Peopling the Palace, a festival to mark the refurbishment of a celebrated East End building.

Handbag is a celebratory gem of a performance with great music, dancing and handbags. It lasts only 15 minutes but is performed six times by over a hundred people recruited from the local community. To date over 600 women and 50 men have taken part in Handbag in 6 different cities. in 2010, it was re-imagined to celebrate the opening of the refurbished Royal Shakespeare Theatre in Stratford-Upon-Avon. *Handbag* Director, Geraldine Pilgrim, says :

"I was originally commissioned by Battersea Arts Centre to come up with a performance for their Grand Hall, an atmospheric ballroom that still contains the joyful memories of all the people who have danced there over the years. I sat in the empty space trying to get inspiration and then a woman came in and put down her handbag.

It's always inspiring to re-imagine Handbag for each new space and we're really excited to be making it for these two very different buildings, each of which will bring something new to the piece. Handbag is about celebration and a sense of joy and we hope to bring a smile to the participants and audiences of Brighton and East London in February."

Geraldine Pilgrim works across theatre and the visual arts and is known for her evocative installations and site-specific performances that create a contemporary dialogue with occupied and deserted historic houses and buildings. Working with the history and architecture of a space, she creates a narrative – imagined and real - to reveal the memories and atmospheres that have built up over the years.

Geraldine trained as a fine artist and theatre designer. She co-founded and became artistic director of <u>Hesitate and Demonstrate</u>, the influential visual theatre company, and has since been making installations, theatre performances and large-scale site-specific events.

Geraldine is associate lecturer at Wimbledon College of Art and visiting lecturer at Central St. Martins, Goldsmiths and LAMDA. She works with professional and nonprofessional performers and a recent project, Tea, made with Complicite Creative Learning, was awarded the National Housing Federation's Community Impact Award 2012.

Geraldine is currently exhibiting The Lost Pagodas, four unique pagodas
