Chris Dobrowolski's new solo performance tours the UK this Spring

Chris Dobrowolski is an artist and maker who works from his garden shed in Colchester, Essex. He studied Fine Art in Hull but when he first got there he built a boat from driftwood to try to escape. Chris has since made a whole series of working vehicles in a similar vein – including a tank, a hovercraft and an aeroplane – each vehicle and escape attempt chartered with its own accompanying story.

Chris' latest project, *All Roads Lead to Rome*, follows a recent road trip from the heart of Essex to the Italian peninsula – a mirror image of the journey that his father took as a Polish soldier during the final months of the Second World War. In the style of a performance-lecture, it brings together storytelling, film, photography and sculpture to reveal the surprising connections between the Italian Campaign of World War II, family history, Cold War politics, the rise of consumerism, car mechanics, contemporary art and classical civilisation.

To make *All Roads Lead to Rome*, Chris spent a year repairing his father's ancient but beloved Triumph Herald Estate car. Purchased just before he was born, the car is a testament to "make do and mend", the antithesis of modern consumerism. Chris says:

"The car is of great personal significance because my father bought it when my mother found out she was pregnant with her second child – me. My father taught me how to repair and service it and we managed to keep it working for far longer than it was designed to last.

Driving my old car to Italy was a very real journey to an almost illusory place; a kind of modern "Grand Tour" to seek out some of the places my father would have encountered whilst in action, and an attempt to verify his stories which have, over the years, achieved mythological status."

Whilst in Italy, Chris gathered the material for *All Roads Lead to Rome*, including old photos, new film and some surprising mechanical objects. The Triumph Herald originally accompanied Chris for his showings of *All Roads Lead to Rome*, before the car was tragically stolen and burnt out on the last night of his Edinburgh Festival run. The only lasting remnant of the car, the passenger seat, will still escort Chris across his UK tour. Join Chris and this old seat in a witty and moving testament to the journeys of our fathers in a material world so different from today.
