Artist duo Curious (Helen Paris and Leslie Hill) present a new performance, Wild Longings, the first work since their return to the UK following 5 years in the USA teaching at Stanford University. This luscious garden tour is sown with stories of transformation, conservation tips and songs to create a multisensory performance that is rooted in a celebration of inclusivity, interconnectivity and survival.

Listen to a passionate ode to the transgender Fortingall Yew by enchanting tour-guide Helen Paris, learn hands-on horticultural tips from raconteur gardener Leslie Hill and allow yourself to be beguiled by



chanteuse Claudia Barton with a fantasia of song inspired by the botanical delights in St Dunstan in the East Church Garden, London. <u>Here is a taster of the songs and ode.</u>

St Dunstan in the East is claimed to be the most beautiful public garden in the City. After the Church of St Dunstan was bombed in the Blitz of 1941, the ruins, and the unscathed church tower and steeple designed by Sir Christopher Wren, were turned into an enchanting public garden. Wild Longings at 2 Degrees Festival 2019 is supported by the City of London Corporation.

In a time of huge social and political upheaval and change, Wild Longings transforms this City of London garden for two days, seeding conversation about how we might reconnect to one another and our environment, and how acts of rooting and uprooting might help sustain and nurture the things we hold dear.

"The need for us all to educate ourselves about human-caused environmental damage and explore more sustainable futures has never been more urgent. Art has the extraordinary capacity to critique the shortcomings of things as they are while imagining things as they might be. Our aim is to create experiences that are inspiring, engaging and enriching that ultimately encourage global sustainability and survival whilst celebrating local diversity and interconnectivity."

Alongside each performance of Wild Longings, Curious have devised a 3-month paid professional development and mentoring opportunity for an emerging London-based LGBQTIA+ artist interested in the environment.
